## The D and J Lloyd Community First Fund

**The D and J Lloyd Community First Fund** offer grants to support voluntary and community groups working in Cambridgeshire to:

- 1. **Provide support and relief** to those that are in need, in particular those suffering financial hardship, illness, social isolation or homelessness or negative effects of old age.
- 2. **Promote the arts**, in particular but not exclusively work to help those at a disadvantage to take part in arts activities.
- 3. **Protect the environment** and or sites or buildings of historic or architectural importance.
- 4. **Promote learning, skills development and education** (excluding areas of statutory responsibility) to those that are marginalized or excluded from society.

## **Funded Projects**

**Bedazzle Projects** received £2,000 to provide support towards the costs of the 2017 annual integrated show 'Imagine'.

**Cambridge Community Church** received £1,400 to provide hampers of Christmas food to 150 disadvantaged people in the Romsey and Abbey areas of Cambridge.

The Meadows Children and Family Wing received £2,500 to provide a course of The Freedom Programme for 12 women who are or who have been affected by Domestic Violence and a weekly 2 hour specialist drop-in for at least 20 women affected by Domestic Violence and their children.

The Ferry Project received £900 to contribute towards providing a 14 bed emergency night shelter for homeless individuals.

**Volunteer Centre Fenland** received £2,500 to support 25 disadvantaged young people to produce a magazine for young people in Wisbech.

**Cambridge Junction** received £3,000 to run the Total Arts Film Festival involving at least 60 young people to challenge the preconceptions and expectations of what young people with disabilities can achieve.
